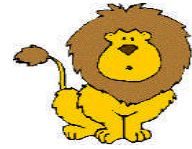

November 2011 PTO Meeting Minutes

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 PM. 14 people were in attendance.

1. October Minutes: The October meeting minutes were passed unanimously.

2. Principal's Report:

Spirit day will be 11/29 and the Pride Club is having hat day on Friday [11/18] with a monetary donation. Since we're now on trimesters, report cards are being distributed on 12/12 and conferences are being held on 12/14 and 12/15. Mr. Testa distributed copies and reviewed the Home/School Compact stressing the importance of it being the responsibility of the family, student and staff. The School Plan is being revised and includes communications, an instructional piece, safety and PBIS. He will ask the PTO for our input on the school's brochure that is based on the state's brochure.

3. Committee Updates:

Butterbraid delivery will be on 11/21 from 5-7 pm. Profits were \$806.40 and the sales of citrus this year was down a little. The snowflake fair is being held on 12/7-12/9 and Karen Siriani is looking for volunteers to run it and help the children shop. Karen provided a list of the items, the quantities available and the costs.

Programs and Assemblies-Leslie Johnson is coming for the 5th graders to do a creative writing session with Mrs. Leach's class in January. A schoolwide, anti-bullying assembly is being planned for everyone and Evelyn Miller from Ellington was suggested as a speaker.

Comments were positive for the Family Fun Night. The magician was great and 260 tickets were given out. Jessica is doing a terrific job on the yearbook and is collecting pictures of the students.

4. Treasurer's Report:

Box Tops earned \$750 in this submission and Kim Boulette encouraged families to keep sending them in. The fall fundraiser made \$6,000. Shopping card orders are now being processed weekly until Christmas. Families are encouraged to buy these to do their holiday shopping. On average, we make \$150 per order and parents can bring the forms to family, friends and coworkers.

5. Other Business:

A request was made for agenda items for the meeting being held on 12/1 between the PTO presidents and the Superintendent.

A parent inquired about an incident occurring where a younger child with a paraprofessional staff member opened a back door for a stranger who was asking for directions. It was clarified that the person was not let in to the building. Teachers have been asked to do a lesson on safety in school and Mrs. Gerner suggested that a hand signal be used to direct visitors around to the office.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:50 PM.
